By-law 9: Members of Board of Directors, Committees and Club Delegate to Skate Canada

a. The members of the Board of Directors and the Club Delegate to Skate Canada and Skate Ontario must be members in good standing of the Club, be registrants of Skate Canada, be of legal age (18 years and older) and be eligible persons (with the exception of the Coaching Representative) as defined by Skate Canada Rules. These positions will be appointed at the Annual General Meeting.

The proposed amendment will be presented to the Annual General Meeting or Special Meetings. All amendments must be submitted at least 30 21 days before the respective meeting. No amendment to the Constitution or By-laws of the Club shall be accepted from the floor at any meeting.
